Democrat Tim Sheldon is the incumbent for Commissioner District Two:

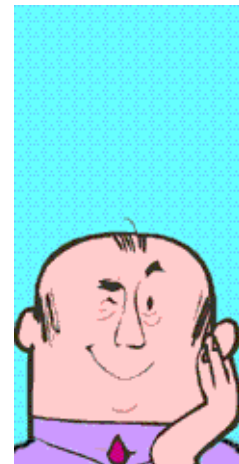


Sheldon has three challengers including Republican Deborah Reis:

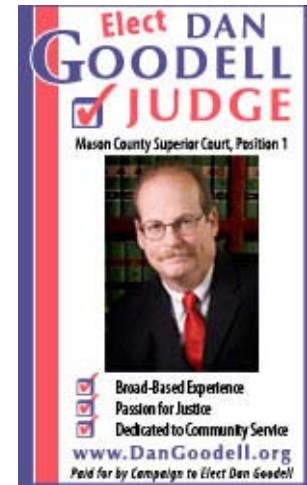
