## Kingman reports on impact fee use

KINGMAN, Ariz. (AP) - Kingman's finance director says the Arizona city's impact fees have saved taxpayers nearly \$4 million on capital projects.

Coral Loyd came to that conclusion in a report to city councilors compiled at the request of 1 councilor who wanted to show that impact fees don't just sit in a bank account.

Loyd's report says Kingman has collected about \$7 million from eight separate categories since the fees were implemented in 2006.

The city has spent about \$4 million and is committed to spend \$6 million more in anticipated fees, primarily on wastewater treatment projects.

Part of the cost of projects is paid for through rate hikes on city sewer customers, but Loyd says the increases would have been higher without impact fees.
