




Bozeman officials approve impact fee changes

Members of the Bozeman City Commissioners have officially adopted road impact fees at 60% which means that people planning to build a single family home will be charged a one time fee of just over \$3,200.

That's up from just under \$2,400 with previous fees.

Meanwhile, anyone building retail space will see costs going down by around \$1,000 thanks to some incentives that are part of the plan.

Bozeman Mayor Kaaren Jacobson voted against the decision, saying that traffic is a major issue for Bozeman residents, and not raising it above the 60% could put traffic projects on hold.
