Growth director steps down after sharp criticism

Lake County's director of Growth Management, whose department was sharply criticized for its pro-growth leanings and poor customer service this summer, resigned Tuesday.

Carol Stricklin told her staff she was accepting a job on Florida's west coast.

Stricklin, who did not immediately return a call to her cell phone seeking comment, was hired in November 2005 at an annual salary of \$92,500. She was formerly the assistant community-development director for the city of Largo. She also worked for Orange County and the city of Orlando as a planner.



In correspondence with her staff, she said: "This was a difficult decision for me because I value and greatly enjoy my position here. I am extremely proud to have worked with such a talented and dedicated group of employees."

County officials credit her with helping to develop the public-lands and impact-fee sections of the county's growth-management department, two of the agency's most controversial areas. But in July, county commissioners raised serious concerns about her department, relaying complaints raised by residents and other officials.
